Due to the inordinate number of cases filed in the District of the Virgin Islands - Division of St. Thomas/St. John pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1325(a) (Improper Entry by Alien), and in order to maintain the proper administration of justice and to appropriately allocate court resources, the Court will assign cases brought under 8 U.S.C. § 1325(a) to magistrate judges in the District of the Virgin Islands on a rotational basis.

Accordingly, it is hereby,

ORDERED that, effective April 7, 2025, all complaints filed pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1325 in the District Court of the Virgin Islands will be assigned to a magistrate judge for the District of the Virgin Islands on a rotating basis; it is further

ORDERED that, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3401(a), any magistrate judge assigned to a case brought under 8 U.S.C. § 1325(a) is hereby specially designated and shall have jurisdiction to try persons accused of, and sentence persons convicted of, a misdemeanor committed within the judicial district of the Virgin Islands; it is further

ORDERED that a magistrate judge who exercises trial jurisdiction pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3401(a) and this Order, and before whom a person is convicted or plead either guilty or nolo contendere, may, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3401(c), direct the probation service of the
